HOW TO ARRIVE TO NH MILANO 2



FROM THE AIRPORT

From the Linate Airport

Take the Bus line 923 toward H.S.Raffaele for 34 stops. Get off at Res. Ponti Milano 2 (Segrate) stop. From there the hotel is approximately 150 meters away. It's a 110 minutes trip and is 1.30€. Taxi: It's a 20 minutes trip and is 20€.

From the Malpensa Airport

Take the express train from Malpensa to Cadorna Station, then take the underground Metro 2 (green line) toward Cologno Nord/Gessate for 8 stops, get off at Cascina Gobba stop. Take the MalpensaShuttle to Central Station, then take the underground metro 2 (green line) toward Cologno Nord/Gessate for 8 stops, get off at Cascina Gobba stop. Transfer to bus line 925 towards Redecesio/Piazza Udine. The stop for NH Milano 2 is the second after San Raffaele Hospital.

Taxi: It's a 1H 30minutes trip and is 100€. Aerobus shuttle: Departs every 30 minutes and costs € 4. Take the OrioShuttle to Central Station, then take the underground metro 2 (green line) toward Cologno Nord/Gessate for 8

stops, get off at Cascina Gobba stop. Transfer to bus line 925 towards Redecesio/Piazza Udine. The stop for NH Milano 2 is the second after San Raffaele Hospital.

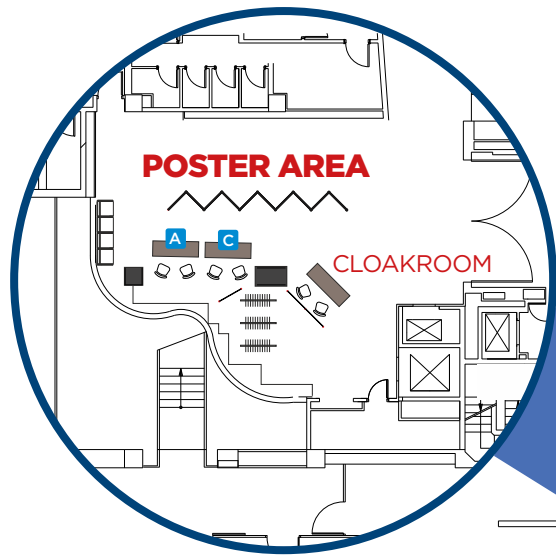

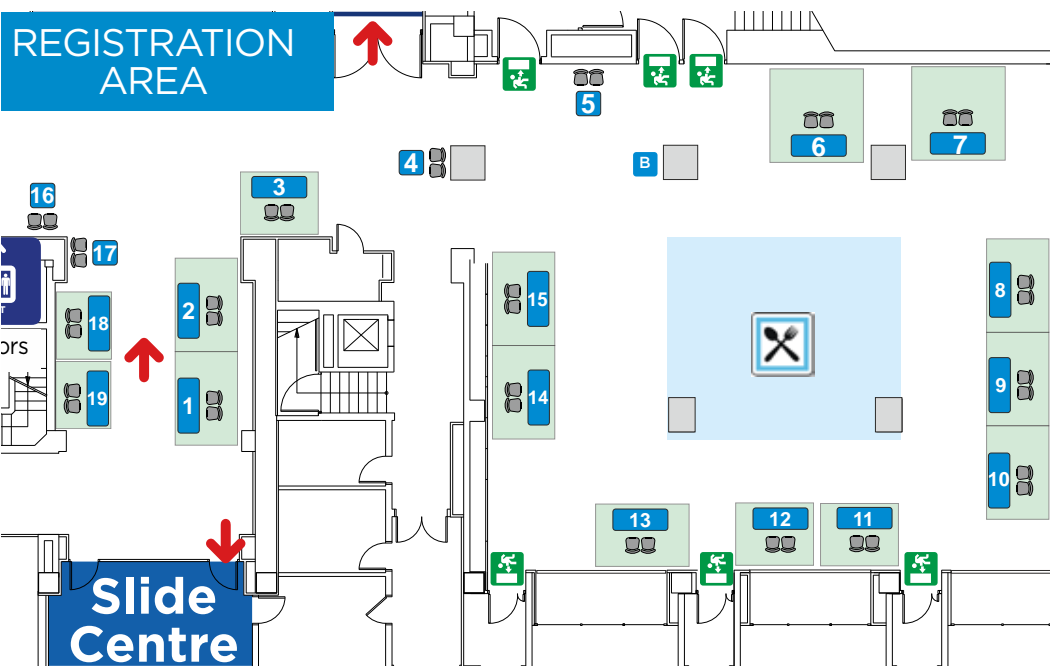

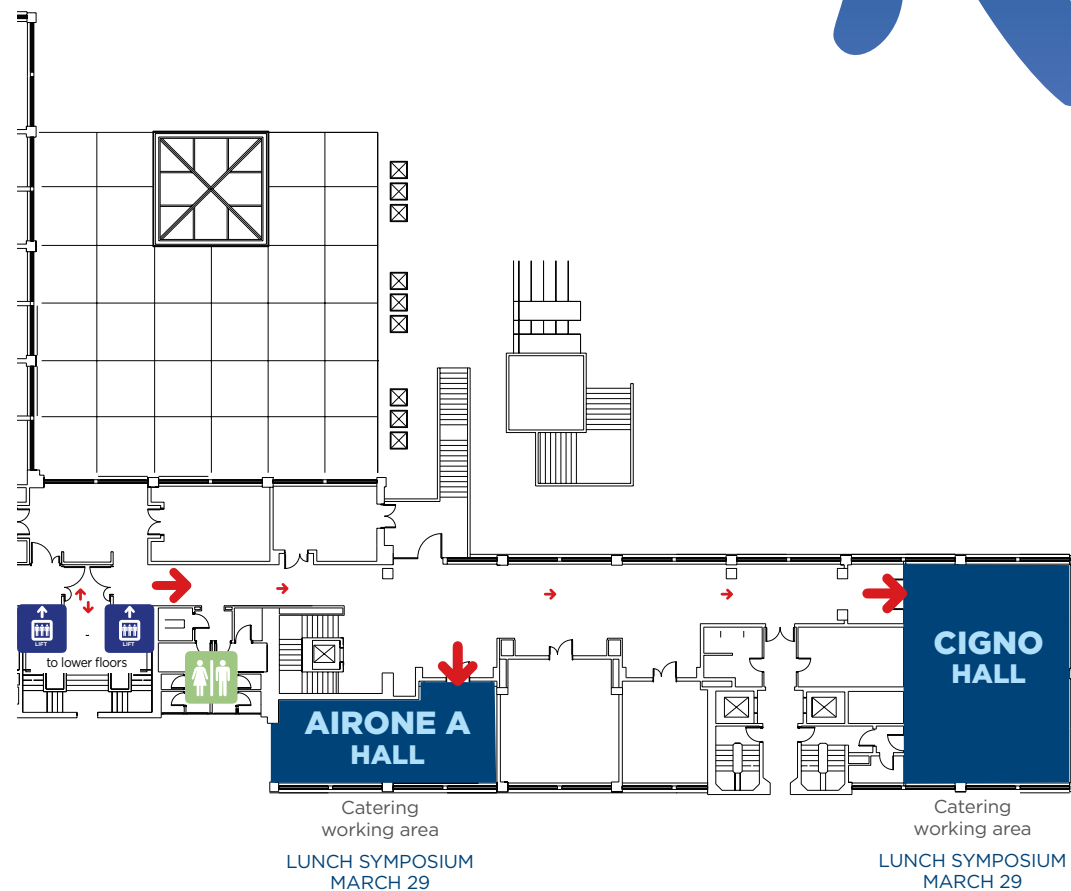
